KNOW THIS... <u>BEFORE PAINTING YOUR KITCHEN CABINETS</u>

Painting the cabinets can give your kitchen a fresh new look and has the appeal of being a budget friendly do-it-yourself project. However, many homeowners have come to regret this experience for reasons that could have been avoided with these insights.

Did you know that many professional painters tend to steer away from painting kitchen cabinets? Why? It's because of the doors and drawers. Painting the bare cabinet boxes is relatively straightforward but the doors are a different story altogether.

PAINTING THE CABINET BOXES: Once you have all the doors, drawers and hardware removed, you're left with bare cabinet boxes that have a flat, even surface that you can easily sand, prep and paint. All you need is a standard paint roller and a quality brush to achieve an adequate finish on then boxes. This is the safe and easy part and it's not overly ambitious for the do-it-yourselfer. But you'll be best served to "stop" at this point and not to proceed with painting the doors.

"When you look at your kitchen, the doors and drawers represent approximately 85% of what you see, so this is the part you want to get right."

PAINTING THE DOORS & DRAWERS: Most cabinet doors have either raised or recessed center panels. These surface variations make it difficult to sand to achieve a consistent base. This non-uniformity of the prepped surface is the leading factor that will make your painted finish prone to chipping and peeling in time to come. But interesting enough, this will be the least of your worries.

The bigger concern is the finished appearance of the doors. Most do-it-yourselfers typically use a roller or paint brush for the doors – and this is where things start to go wrong. Brushing or rolling the doors nearly always results in having the sheen, or glossiness, vary across the door surface. Due to the uneven surfaces of the door, it's nearly impossible to get a consistent paint layer across the surface with a brush or roller. These varying thicknesses of paint is what causes some areas to look glossy and other areas seem flat.

Any one individual door may look fine after you paint it and it's in your garage drying. But after every door is rehung in the kitchen, side by side, and you're 90% done, is when you first encounter that "Uh-Oh" moment. The high sheen areas, in contrast with the low sheen areas, are now all amplified. Aesthetically, this is perhaps the biggest disappointment from a "do-it-yourselfer" perspective.

HVLP PAINT SPRAYER: In order to achieve a professional grade-finish you'll need to use a high-volume, low-pressure (HVLP) sprayer to obtain that desired smooth sheen. These sprayers are very expensive and not to be mistaken with the typical, price friendly, "airless" sprayers that professional house painters use. HVLP sprayers are what's used in manufacturing facilities for furniture and kitchen cabinets. If you hire a reputable professional painter to paint your kitchen, assuming they are equipped with only an airless sprayer, they will set the right expectation with you that it won't be the quality of a "new door" and that you'll still have a varying sheen.

IS IT WORTH IT TO PAINT? Keep the "end game" in mind before you undertake painting your entire kitchen. When you're done, you still have the same kitchen style and functionality – it just has a new color with new door-pulls maybe. The doors themselves are still outdated, maybe warped, and have the same old hinges. The money and time spent on achieving this end game is what lends itself to homeowners regretting this undertaking. But there is hope.
